ONE INTERPRETATION OF THE HUMAN FAMILY TREE

Paleoanthropologists have discovered and named over twenty-five different kinds of fossil human ancestors and extinct relatives (hominins). Throughout this book, you will meet many of these—presented here by their names and representative fossils.
