FAVORITE WAVES

1. Pipeline (Oahu, Hawaii): The place I dreamed of surfing as a kid. It has brought me my most special moments in competition and still gets me excited every day.
2. Kirra/Snapper Rocks/Greenmount (Gold Coast, Australia): The greatest sand bottom pointbreak barrel that exists. With new dredge developments, the wave has reached 2.5 km long.
3. Sebastian Inlet (Florida): My home break and original training/proving ground. Strong local crew and really fun, playful, short rides off a jetty.
4. Soup Bowls (Bathsheba, Barbados): Surf and hang on the beach all day and eat breadfruit and sugarcane with Rastas. Amazingly fun wave on its day.
5. Cloudbreak/Restaurants (Tavarua, Fiji): Two distinct waves and one great island. My introduction to confronting big waves in front of the cameras happened here. One wave (Cloudbreak) has huge character, the other is perfection.
6. Lance's Rights (Mentawai Islands, Indonesia): The empty rights (in 1994) that I always dreamed of surfing one day in the Mentawai Islands, Sumatra.
7. Sandspit (Santa Barbara, California): Fell in love with it in photos but still have yet to catch it on a classic day.
8. G-land (Java, Indonesia): Probably rode the best left of my life here. I was scared at the thought of going there as a kid. Flawless perfection.
9. North Point (Cowaramup, Western Australia): Never surfed it, but I know I will love it. A big, distinct, and unique barreling wave.
10. Three's (Big Island, Hawaii): Our little secret spot.

1. My family: They made me who I am. I owe them all my love and appreciation.
2. Al Merrick: The best man I know. My second father and board shaper.
3. Tom Curren, three-time world champ: I grew up wanting to be him. Thank you, Tom, for your beautiful surfing.

7. Bruce Raymond: He's guided me through so many personal and professional troubles that I can't begin to thank him enough. He's the greatest boss I could have. (President of Quiksilver International marketing and former top-rated pro surfer.)
8. Jeff Johnson and Peff Eick (and families): I have never spent a day with them that I didn't absolutely love and talk about with the guys for days.

BEST CONTEST MOMENTS

1. Semifinal, Pipe Masters, 1995, against Rob Machado: All the purest feelings of competition and friendship came alive for me during this half hour of my life, and I went on to win my third world title on that day. Thank you for the memory, Robbie Todd.
2. Pipe Masters, 1998: I could never dream of a better scenario for myself than this one: the United States versus Australia, two against one, coming from behind. I won my sixth title that day.
3. East Coast Championships, 1982, first place Menehunes: My first *big* win. I was ten years old. I had no idea this would kick start the rest of my life.
4. U.S. titles, 1984, Makaha, Oahu, Hawaii, first place Menehunes: My first of four U.S. title wins. I met most of my good surfing friends at this event, and it was my first Hawaiian experience.
5. Rip Curl Pro, Hossegor, France, 1992: First win on tour. It put me in the ratings lead for the first time and gave me permission to belong at the top.
6. First Annual Quicksilver Pro, G-Land, 1995, first place: Best waves I've ever had in competition. Quicksilver's first adventure surf contest. Got five barrels on my first wave in the finals.
7. Hart's Birthday Bash, 1984, first place: First win against older competitors in an open field. I won my first ticket to Hawaii at this contest, and I never looked back.
8. Excalibur Cup, Sebastian Inlet, 1986, first place Open Men: I was fourteen years old. I won the pro contest, pulled the sword from a stone, and got the girl.
9. Sundeck Pro, Melbourne Beach, Florida, 1984: I made the main event in my first pro event and won my first man-on-man heat ever against an Aussie pro.
10. Pipe Master's, 1999, semifinal vs. Occy: Occy had me on the ropes to beat me for the first time after I won the world title that year. I

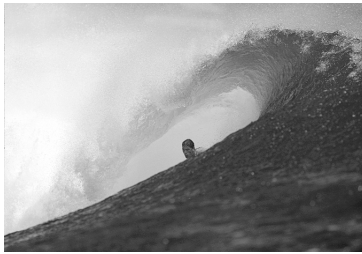
